September 12, 2018

The monthly business meeting of the Hope Township Committee convened at 7:00 P.M. at the Hope Township Municipal Building with the following members present: Mayor Timothy McDonough, Deputy Mayor Christopher John Kruk and Committeeman Terry Urfer, Michael Selvaggi, Esq. and Ted Rodman. Also present were Municipal Clerk, Judith Fisher, RMC.

Under the provisions of the "Open Public Meetings Act", adequate notice of the meeting had been provided by publishing notice in The Star Gazette and The New Jersey Herald and by posting notices in the Hope Post Office and on the Township bulletin boards.

Reports:

Tax Collector: for month ending July 2018 \$180,769.57; YTD \$3,276,175.61.

Warren County Health Department: 119 Nightingale – currently original well being used. Water test pending; 329 High Street – expansion of use beyond the approved septic capacity. Approved septic system has not been installed; 32 Lakeview Avenue – complaint received re: high grass, animals and feral cats. Reinspection conducted and grass was mowed. File closed. Between 406-402 Main Street – complaint received concerning flooding due to possible broken water line, complaint forwarded to Zoning Official. Land of Make Believe complaint received regarding mouse droppings in roll bins and no A/C working in the food locations. No Kennel Activity. Land of Make Believe was inspected and satisfactory. Rabies – 2 dog bites, one quarantined and released. One died (had been injured). Rabies testing done on 2 bats – both negative results. Recreational bathing – Hope Conference Center, Land of Make Believe Pools (3) and Silver Lake Property Owners Association were all inspected and received satisfactory ratings. Royal Family Youth Camp (Camp Hope) was inspected; Cranford West was inspected. Septics/Wells – 3 septic alterations installed; two septic alteration applications were approved.

Use of Facilities Request: Joel Peterson, Bereavement Counselor/Wavefree Community Outreach & Educational Coordinator. Mr. Urfer motioned to accept application and waive the fee; Mr. Kruk seconded. Motion carried and a voice vote was unanimous. Mrs. Fisher stated needs a certificate of insurance and a 503c certificate.

"Go Green with Hope" Green Fair – April 13, 2019 from 9 am – 1 pm at Hope Township Elementary School. Just an FYI from the Environmental Commission.

Wendy – Sand Pond Society – Use of Community Center for dinner for the actors/actresses in Friday the 13th films. Sunday, October 14th. Mr. Urfer motioned to waive fee; Mr. Kruk seconded. Motion carried and a Roll Call vote followed: Mr. Urfer – yes; Mr. Kruk - yes; Mayor McDonough – yes.

Michael Selvaggi, Esq.: spoke about the ATC Ordinance. Explained to the Township Committee and public in attendance what the ATC are for. Explained the process by which the Ordinance would move through the Township and to public hearing. Not covered by the Right-to-Farm Act.

Mayor Tim McDonough: Mayor McDonough mentioned the 9/11 candlelight celebration that occurred at Swayze Mill Park. Marvin Fish has tendered his resignation to the Planning Board. Mayor McDonough would like to honor Mr. Fish in some way and asked the Township Committee to please give it some thought. Mr. Urfer motioned to accept his resignation; Mr. Kruk seconded (with regrets). Motion carried and a voice vote was unanimous. Mr. Urfer would like to make a motion to appoint Donna Marie to the Planning Board to take Mr. Fish's position, Mr. Kruk seconded. Motion carried and a voice vote was unanimous. Mrs. Fisher will notify the Secretary, Mrs. Schemm of this appointment.

Deputy Mayor Christopher John Kruk: Silver Lake Property Association – asked if we could get SLPOA sign under street sign so that people can find it. Don can order it. Yogurt drinks (Tammera) – asked if they could be sold at the Hope Picnic. Committee will look into it for next year. He is being encouraged to hand out free samples.

Committeeman Urfer: Mr. Urfer discussed with Mr. Selvaggi the parcels of land that the Township wants to "auction off" to clear off of our books. Mr. Selvaggi explained they can be offered for sale without going to

auction to any adjacent property owner (annexation/merger) with their existing property. Ag Board discussion took place regarding a display at the Hope Picnic on where farmland has been preserved. Sandy will be working on labeling/larger map. Farmland assessment seminar for woodland owner's information received. DeCarolis - \$100 per month expense – where do we stand? Cleaning up the yard is going well. Pews will be leaving soon. Will get on top of the Community Center light project as well.

Fire Department Report: Number of calls – 13; Man hours - 103. Special detail 3; Night Man hours 96. Total hours for August 234 hours. Application for membership was received from John Mikish. Motion to accept Mr. Urfer; seconded by Mr. Kruk. Roll Call: Mr.Urfer – yes; Mr. Kruk – yes; Mayor McDonough – yes.

Township Engineer Report: Generator – ballards are in, inspection was done. Fairclough will not fill tank until the ballards are painted yellow. Mrs. Fisher stated she needs three quotes and a certificate of insurance from whomever performed the ballard work. Osmun road – paving to occur October 2. Birch Ridge – paving to occur October 3. Landfill – DEP is looking for additional files. Mayor McDonough asked Mr. Rodman to hold off on speaking to Mr. Singh until we hear back from Ms. Pflugh. State aid due December 8. Mayor McDonough suggested putting in for Cemetery Road and whatever roads Mr. Urfer and Don decide are in bad shape. Drainage needs to be looked at over in Silver Lake (any drains the Township owns).

Old Business:

Verizon Nodes: No change in status.

Benbrook & Stevens: Easement at the Distillery – no change.

New Business:

Connie Loughlin spoke to the Township Committee regarding a tree that needs to be taken down near the Long House. Asked for help from the Township Committee in the expense of taking it down. Township Committee asked to get estimates before making any decisions regarding helping towards the expense of it. Mr. Loughlin will have estimate for the next Committee meeting.

Joel Peterson introduced himself as a Bereavement Counselor. Interested in using the Moravian Grange/ Community Center – Coping with the Holidays. Free public lecture series. Only one night is needed.

Farmer's Market Permit – correspondence received from Jim Alworth. To be held between Dogwood and the liquor store. Would have to sell 75% of farmer grown products.

RESOLUTION 2018-55 DECLARING TOWNSHIP OF HOPE SUPPORT FOR THE JCP&L RELIABLITY PLUS

WHEREAS: The Township of Hope recognizes that reliable electric service plays a crucial role in the daily lives of Township residents; and

WHEREAS: The Township of Hope recognizes that reliable electric service also is critical to the local businesses within our community, and drives commerce in our Township and across the region; and

WHEREAS: The Township of Hope supports efforts to enhance our energy infrastructure to continue to provide families and businesses the reliable source of energy they need; and

WHEREAS: The Township of Hope supports efforts to enhance the reliability and resiliency of the electric distribution system against severe weather and reduce the number of customers affected by outages and shorten the duration of outages; and

WHEREAS: The Township of Hope has been informed that Jersey Central Power and Light Company's (JCP&L) Reliability Plus includes approximately \$400 million in targeted investments above and beyond its regular annual investments to enhance JCP&L's service reliability and resiliency; and

WHEREAS: The Township of Hope has been informed that the JCP&L plan includes nearly 4,000 enhancements that will help the reliability and resiliency of overhead and underground distribution lines, as well as new equipment to reduce the number of customers affected by outages and shorten the duration of outages; and

WHEREAS: The Township of Hope has been informed that the JCP&L plan also outlines additional vegetation management to reduce the potential for tree damage, which is the primary cause of outages during severe storms in JCP&L's service area.

WHEREAS: The Township of Hope has been informed that JCP&L expects the plan's economic benefit to customers and businesses from enhanced reliability and resiliency will be \$1.9 billion over the estimated life of the equipment installed through the program; and

WHEREAS: The Township of Hope has been informed that JCP&L estimates the initial increase on the monthly bill for an average residential customer would be about 25 cents. NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that Mayor Tim McDonough and Township of Hope hereby finds and declares:

That JCP&L's Reliability Plus will benefit residents and businesses in the Township of Hope and throughout Warren County by making JCP&L's electric distribution system during storm and non-storm events more resistant to outages and enabling the system to recover more quickly when outages do occur and increase the distribution system's resiliency, operational flexibility, safety and security.

JCP&L's Reliability Plus should be approved by the New Jersey Board of Public Utilities.

INTRODUCTION ORDINANCE 2018-04:

ORDINANCE OF TOWNSHIP OF HOPE, COUNTY OF WARREN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, TO AMEND ARTICLE 20-14 OF ZONING ORDINANCES OF TOWNSHIP OF HOPE TO INCLUDE ALTERNATIVE TREATMENT CENTERS LICENSED BY NEW JERSEY DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH, DIVISION OF MEDICINAL MARIJUANA TO BE PERMITTED USES IN THE POP-PLAN OFFICE PARK DISTRICT **WHEREAS**, the Governor of the State of New issued Executive Order No. 6 (2018) directing that the New Jersey Department of Health ("Department") consider ways to expand access to marijuana for medical purposes;

WHEREAS, the Department proposed new medicinal marijuana rules intended to increase the number of licensed Alternative Treatment Centers ("ATCs"); and

WHEREAS, the Township of Hope believes establishing ATCs in its municipality would enable more patients to gain sensible access to medical marijuana to treat authorized debilitating medical conditions; and

WHEREAS, the Township of Hope believes that the POP-Plan Office Park District would be the appropriate zone district where licensed ATCs should be established.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Township Committee of the Township of Hope, County of Warren, State of New Jersey, that the Hope Township Zone Ordinance, Section 20-14.1 be amended as follows:

Section 1:

20-14.1 - Principal Uses.

(c) Alternative Treatment Centers licensed by the State of New Jersey, Department of Health, Medicinal Marijuana Division.

Section 2:

<u>Severability.</u> The various parts, sections and clauses of this Ordinance are hereby declared to be severable. If any part, sentence, paragraph, section or clause is adjudged unconstitutional or invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, the remainder of this Ordinance shall not be affected thereby.

Section 3.

<u>Repealer</u>. Any ordinances or parts thereof in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed as to their inconsistencies only.

Section 4.

Effective Date. This Ordinance shall take effect upon final passage and publication.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, that the above Ordinance was introduced and passed on first reading at the Regular Business Meeting of the Governing Body of the Township of Hope held in the Municipal Building on the 12 day of September, 2018, and the same shall come up for public hearing at the Regular Business Meeting of the Governing Body to be held on the 10 day of October 2018, at 7:00 P.M., at which times any persons interested shall be given the opportunity to be heard concerning said Ordinance. Following the public hearing, said Ordinance shall be considered for final adoption.

Chris Rusin spoke about the professionalism and friendliness of the Clerk and Deputy Clerk and that the Township committee made a wise decision in hiring them.

Seeing there was no other business for tonight, this meeting of the Hope Township Committee was adjourned at 8:45 p.m. on a motion made by Mr. Urfer, seconded by Mr. Kruk. Motion carried.
